Boil Water Advisory At Regina Beach

Town Constructing A New Water Treatment Plant

The residents of Regina Beach needed to take some precautions with their water last week. "A boil water warning was issued because the new water treatment plant was being tied into the main water lines," said Regina Beach

Mayor George Soloman Schofield. "The engineers warned us that this would happen, so we knew it was coming. Once connected, the lines need to be flushed and a sample will be taken again. If everything comes back okay then the boil advisory will be lifted. The town staff did a great job

responding to the requirements."

The Regina Beach town council has been working towards a new water treatment plant for the community the last six years. The construction of the plant which will be located about 100 yards south of the

Upgrades Done To Local Trail

An Oasis Of Nature

Outdoor recreation including walking, biking, hiking are popular activities in the valley. Individuals who enjoy doing this will be pleased to know that the Lumsden/Deer Valley Trans-Canada Trail was upgraded this year. Project manager Gary Howland said, "The project came about because 50% of the funding was made available through the Federal Economic Action Plan (EAP) which was channelled through the National Trails Coalition (NTC). An application for funding was submitted by the Great Plains Trans-Canada Trail Association (GPTCTA) which

developed the Saw-whet Trail west of Lumsden, in cooperation with the Town of Lumsden."

The total cost of the trail project upgrade was \$14,200, with 50% coming from the EAP program and the remainder coming from the Town of Lumsden, GPTCTA, Scarecrow Festival, Deer Valley Golf & Estates and individuals including Bill Shurniak of Assiniboia who made a very generous donation. As well, the RM of Lumsden was supportive by assisting with the placement of the signage and in granting approval to access the RM road allowances and in-kind
