George May re:  
School buses:

George May was in attendance to discuss his concerns with the parking of larger industrial equipment, trucks and busses in residential areas.

George stated that there are others in his neighborhood with the same concerns as his. They feel the integrity of residential areas are compromised by parking large busses in driveways and onto civic streets. There are further issues of prolonged equipment idling fumes, safety and stress on road structures.

Doug Ross – Development Control Officer for the City of Regina had submitted some regulatory information to give Council some ideas when dealing with this type of problem.

The City of Regina Traffic Bylaw 9900 prohibits a vehicle from parking on any portion of a sidewalk. This regulation would help in enforcing situations when a long vehicle is protruding into the street.

The City of Regina Zoning Bylaw 9250 prohibits the parking of any vehicle in a residential zone which has a gross vehicle weight that exceeds 2722 kg(6,000 lbs). This regulation is meant to not allow the parking of 3-ton dump trucks, backhoes, semi tractor/trailers etc.

Doug Ross stated that these regulations are enforced quite successfully to ensure that appropriate vehicle types are parked in residential zones.

George May had spoke to Prairie Valley School Division who had stated that they would like some direction from the town.

George stated that himself and others would like to see a bylaw in place that will set out guidelines for this type of problem.

Administrator to send a letter to the School Board to see if they have any solution to this situation.

Administrator to compile sample copies of similar bylaws.
